# Privacy: It's about control and power

In the Internet and phone connected world we live in now, privacy is a much more complex concept. Because information can be shared both explicitly and tacitly in the blink of an eye, control is much more challenging.

### **Context Collapse**

Now when we share information or data, it is very difficult to exhaustively examine all the different potential users of that information or data. Further it is virtually impossible to determine all the ways it might be re-used by others in different contexts.





# Data Collection and Privacy

- As we collect more and more data, the challenge of protecting privacy becomes increasingly complex
- Traditionally privacy has been protected through the anonymisation of data.
- As more and more data becomes publicly available, the challenge to effectively anonymise data increases.

## History of De-Anonymisation




In 2000, Latanya Sweeney found that 87% of the population in the United States could likely be uniquely identified by their five-digit ZIP code, combined with their gender and date of birth

In 2007, Arvind Narayanan and Vitaly Shmatikov de-anonymize Netflix Prize data










Anonymous public data from London's bike-share program proved vulnerable to de-anonymisation techniques



# Absence of data is a kind of data.

Let's imagine you know the aggregate income for a town. If one person moves away, by re-calculating the aggregate income, you now know the income of the person who moved.

In a development context, choosing to gather data in one area may result in different outcomes for areas where data is not gathered.

These days, choosing not to participate in a social network reveals information about a person. As a recruiter, would you trust anyone without any online profiles? Perhaps the answer is still 'yes' now but in the future?





### **Taken Out of Context**



In Canada in 2013, a woman was denied entry into the United States based on medical data that ought to have been private.

### We can imagine other scenarios:

What if Open Data resources from a country like Kenya were used by the United Kingdom to profile immigration applications?

What if data from an air quality sensor network were used by an insurance company to raise rates in a marginalised community?

All data collection requires thought about potential consequences.
